It's been nearly two years since the launch of our City on a Hill Vision, and we are continuing to move forward! To date, we have added 5 additional elementary classrooms and 4 portable classrooms to accommodate the catastrophic growth that has taken place.

The need to finish both phases of the vision and to build our new 9-12 HS Building on our new land across the street is more urgent and necessary than ever! Currently, we are focusing on raising the funds to pay off all debt related to expansion costs we have accumulated in our current building, which is just over \$3.7 million.

While this is certainly a big chunk of money, it pales in comparison to the power of our God and what He has called Tri-unity Christian School to be in the communities of Wyoming and Grandville for just such a time as this.

A CITY ON A HILL does not hide its light by looking to blend in with the darkness around it but shines brightly in the midst of that darkness.

A CITY ON A HILL is firmly planted on the high ground of Biblical authority, enabling it to stand firm against the shifting winds of cultural compromise.

A CITY ON A HILL that is a place where a culture of honor, respect, and excellence is the expectation, not the exception.

A CITY ON A HILL that challenges students to actually KNOW God better rather than being content to simply know OF God better. A City on a Hill is never satisfied with head knowledge but seeks true heart transformation.

We are very grateful to have Courtney, along with her knowledge and experience, in this role moving forward. She is a great addition to the staff family.

When August rolled around, our athletic teams were beginning practice. The seasons looked to be full of optimism as we have some very good athletes returning to our halls this year. Our boys' soccer team returned to the pitch after taking a year off last year, and they improved drastically throughout the season. A young team, sometimes starting with as many as 8 or 9 freshmen, battled tough and gained valuable experience that they will look to build on as they grow and move from year to year. Our cross country team had a couple of exceptional standouts to highlight. On the boys' side, brother duo Tyler Laansma (11th grade) and Lincoln Laansma (8th grade) finished 1st and 2nd in the conference standings. A phenomenal accomplishment for the whole program! In Defender football and volleyball, we saw a couple of teams who brought home the hardware, both winning the conference. In football, it was the first time since 2018, whereas volleyball has now started a streak of conference championships, bringing home a trophy in both 2022 and 2023.

First, we want to thank our cheer team duo of Amy Langeler and Christie Eerdmans, who have poured into our cheer program for the last 8 years.
