The 2021-2022 season had a sense of normalcy to it compared to just a year prior. With a lot of COVID-19 restrictions that we faced a year ago lifted, it gave our student athletes and coaches a sense of relief to not constantly be battling the unknown. Our fall season (2021) was off to a great start with Football and Soccer competing hard and our Volleyball team also had an outstanding season, and under Coach Petrick, advanced to the Regional Final, where they fell a little short. The 2021 Spiritual Life theme of "Raise the Bar" was put into place by our fall coaches, and I am excited to see how our teams build on this success in the fall of 2022.

Just like the fall, it was nice for our winter athletes to return to normal as well. A full gym at Friday night basketball games felt like forever ago, but it was good to see the community able to be back out and supporting our Defenders. Both our Boys and Girls Varsity teams had successful years. The Girls lost a close, competitive game in Districts, while our Boys made it all the way to the end of the season and capped it off with a State Championship, our fifth in program history! We had a few long-held records on the Boys' side get re-written this year by Brady Titus. Most notably, he broke the scoring record for most points in a game, season, and career. As we moved forward to spring, the

change of weather brought plenty of new opportunities. It was nice to be able to be back outside, enjoying God's creation, while cheering on our baseball, golf, and soccer teams! For the second and third time in program history we had two golfers (Owen Rosendall and Hezekiah Noble) qualify for the State Championship. Additionally, our boy's baseball team won the Alliance League Conference Championship, but fell just short of a district championship in the title game.

With the continued growth of our school, it is only natural to think of "what's next" for Tri-Unity Athletics. While it is exciting to dream about the new school and Defender Athletic Park that will one day be our home, we are grateful to God for the many blessings He has currently given us. We have a great set of coaches that continue to "Raise the Bar" and be good examples for our student athletes. We have great families to support and cheer on our teams. 

Soccer was a big part of your life at Tri-unity and you compiled quite a career. How far was soccer able to take you and how did those experiences help shape you into who you are and what you are doing today?

I played soccer post college semi-professionally and professionally for 3 seasons. I was on the roster with teams in North Carolina and England, and was even able to play with a few USA women's national team players while being coached by my dream coach at the time.

This was a really exciting period of life because I could 100% dedicate myself to something I loved with nothing else competing for my attention! I was able to put my dream out there, which felt very vulnerable. That in particular gave me confidence to continue to run after things that I love despite the fear, even now. It was also very stretching, since soccer is a sport based on taking risks while still needing to keep good stats. There was plenty of pressure, and I realized how much I thrive off challenges as well as how to be okay with mistakes.



In addition, each season, I switched teams and countries, so it took effort to find a place on the team, make friends, and adjust to the new city. This showed me how much I crave community and the ability to invest in long term relationships, a church, and being near family. It helped me fully jump into my life now in Grand Rapids and embrace settling down.

Life has changed a lot for you since "hanging up your boots." What does a day in the life of Katie Trimble look like today?

I work from home these days for Amway as an Experience Designer. It is a fancy term for someone who studies how users interact with digital experiences like websites and apps. Companies cannot afford to make every digital idea they can think of, so my position helps the team identify user problems, explore new ways to solve user's problems, and guide decisions of where to invest.

Outside of work, no day is ever the same! It is a lot of learning new things. Sometimes that means I am learning how to refurbish historic windows and other days it means I am figuring out adulting skills like grilling or taking care of a hot tub. It also includes a good amount of time with friends and family, but every day is really quite different.

In addition to your day job, you've recently made the huge leap into the world of a small business owner. Why now? Why choose that industry? What are the risks vs. rewards?

A year and a half ago, I purchased a bed & breakfast that now operates as a wedding venue, known as Alden Orchards. I always



wanted to be an entrepreneur, and the market was prime after many weddings were delayed during Covid, causing a high demand for venues the following years. I spiritually knew this was where God was leading me, but it still came with some nervous, sleepless nights.

The biggest motivator for the wedding business was the opportunity to restore the 1885 home and to explore interior design over the next few years of renovations. That reward has not quite come to fruition yet, but in the meantime, the business allows me to see the support of my family and all the effort they have made to invest in this adventure. It really means the world to me. They even went to the extent of helping me host my own wedding on the property last summer, which was really special.

The venue has increased my confidence in taking business risks and makes other ideas

in the future seem more feasible. I can now dream even bigger.

The TCS Community has traditionally always supported its own by using community-owned businesses and contractors when possible. How could someone reading this and looking for a new chic wedding venue get a hold of you to find out more?

I would love to host celebrations with those from the TCS community! The space is open for weddings along with hosting midweek workshops/retreats (unfortunately unable to offer the space for open houses...). + WHO?

Gifts are applied toward each current school year and are renewed/declined in March concurrent with re-enrollment for the following school year.

+ WHY?

Over 50% of families at TCS request tuition assistance each year for a total need of over \$200,000. Further still, several more families seek qualified assistance beyond what is available. Consequently, our fundraising goals increase each year to accommodate this growing need and the families qualified to receive it.
